SUBJECT: GENERAL: Operational
SPECIFIC: CAUSA

1. Although the CAUSA visit has been cancelled, it is quite probable that he will be able to visit the United States sometime in the future. Therefore we should like you to be aware of our reactions to BORN 2733. A cable containing this information was ready for transmission to you when we received word of the cancellation.

2. Rest assured that all concerned here in KIBARK are well aware of the importance of CAUSA's position in the Federal Republic. Our cable, DIR 04979, was not intended to convey any other impression. The reason we recommended curtailment of the proposed seven day visit is the simple fact that there would not be enough to talk about with CAUSA which would take more than about a day. Consequently we could not see the need for his remaining here in Washington as our guest for five or six extra days. Taking into consideration official discussions, luncheons, dinners, and sightseeing, two to three days in this vicinity would be sufficient. We had considered also the possibility of a trip to Williamsburg or the like.

3. Our cable apparently also gave cause for inference of underestimation because we stated that no definite arrangements could be made until we knew exactly when CAUSA was coming. Any official visits sponsored by KIBARK require a tremendous amount of effort and coordination back here. We cannot ask senior KIBARK personnel to arrange their schedules on a stand-by basis for an indefinite period. When DIR 04979 was sent, all we knew was that CAUSA might possibly be here sometime between 9 and 17 June. Without more specific dates we could not arrange conference rooms (which are used heavily), we could not even select senior personnel to meet with CAUSA since such personnel operate on a tight appointment basis, are frequently out of the city, etc.
