

GOERING, Hstuf, Fritz. SCHELLENBERG took GOERING on his personal staff in 1944 on the recommendation of Frl. SCHIENKE, his secretary. GOERING, though married, was hoping to be divorced from his wife and to marry SCHIENKE. He was then about 40 years of age and had previously worked in Act IV. SCHELLENBERG did not use him for intelligence work: his chief duty was to look after important guests, such as MUSY, in the villa in which he lived. He did, however, on occasion exploit GOERING's former contact with Act IV to facilitate liaison, and his friendship with BASINSKI, a hotel owner, with a view to using the hotel business for purposes of the G.I.S.
