<p>1. Headquarters cache records and a review of the pertinent files disclosed no information about possible recovery of arms caches 2A and 14A mentioned in reference. To satisfy our curiosity we would appreciate whatever information is available to you that might indicate that these two caches had been examined.</p> <p>2. Since cache packaging methods were in the early developmental stage during the years 1951 through 1955 when referenced arms were cached, Headquarters seriously doubts that any of the weapons or ammunition would be serviceable if recovered. For planning purposes and to provide a realistic estimate of the assets available to Austrian Stay-behinds, headquarters suggests that, if at all feasible, you examine one of the 1954 five man caches and submit a report on the condition of the contents.</p>
