<p>1. Forwarded herewith are the progress reports on Subject areas for the period 1 January through 28 February 1959. As you are undoubtedly aware, our plans for these two months were thrown off balance by [] unfortunate injury. We expect his return to duty by the end of March at which time we shall be able to resume operations as usual.</p> <p>2. During February [] spent a week culling inactive agent files, checking into ways and means of obtaining timely information from GHRANAL immigration records and reading up on the staybehind operations (GRIVINE and GRICE) presently handled by Vienna Case Officers. The inactive agent files contained nothing of interest, but we have obtained, through the good offices of [] the promise of current information from GHRANAL on a monthly basis. REPORT ON UNCONVENTIONAL WARFARE AREA NO. 1 FOR THE PERIOD 1 JANUARY 1959 THROUGH 26 FEBRUARY 1959

I. Progress

A. Personnel: No change.

B. Status:

1. During the period GRELAMED-26 has asked that two persons previously spotted for wartime use be removed from the list and has submitted three new names for inclusion. No longer to be considered suitable are Identity 1 and Identity 2. The replacements are Identity 3, Identity 4 and Identity 5. GRELAMED-26 has not yet given us any biographic data on these three individuals and for that reason we cannot request traces on them at this time.

2. Neither GRELAMED-4 nor GRELAMED-11 were contacted during the period. GRELAMED-4 is supposed to have located and documented two or three LZ/EE's in and around UN Area No. 1. Whether he has accomplished this task is unknown, but Case Officer's hopes are not very sanguine.

C. Security: There have been no changes in the security of the operation in this area. It should be noted, however, that GRELAMED-26 has friendly relations with the head of the local security forces (Gendarmerie).

D. Training: None of the agents have undergone any training during the period.

E. Equipment: No change.

F. Administration: No salary or expense payments were made during the period.

II. Planning: No change.

REPORT ON UNCONVENTIONAL WARFARE AREA NO. 3 FOR THE PERIOD 1 JANUARY/28 FEBRUARY 1959

I. Progress:

- A. Personnel: No change. Preliminary steps have been taken to locate a resident P/A and W/T operator.
- B. Status: As previously reported, we have not yet satisfied minimum requirements for this area. GRIMPASTE, of course, remains a highly trained and valuable asset.
- C. Security: No change. In a recent cold contact with GRIMPASTE displayed a highly developed sense of security in satisfying himself as to status.
- D. Training: No change.
- E. Equipment: No change.
- F. Administration: No funds were disbursed during the period.

II. Planning:

GRIMPASTE's Kitbushal cache is to be replaced during the last part of April 1959. Preceding the caching operation, GRIMPASTE will come to Munich for a one-day brush up on W/T procedures. We also plan a practical field exercise in conjunction with the exhumation of the old equipment.

REPORT ON UNCONVENTIONAL WARFARE AREA NO. 5 FOR THE PERIOD 1 JANUARY/26 FEBRUARY 1959I. Progress:

A. Personnel: No change. However, if recruitment and testing of Subject of [] in March is successful, he will replace GRRPAIR-15 who will then be reassigned to UW Area No. 6.

B. Status:

1. There have been no major alterations in the status of the two agents presently assigned to this area. GRRPAIR-7 is continuing his operational planning, the initial results of which will be reviewed with him during the next period. Case Officer had a meeting with Subject of [] in January (See EASA-5155, 22 January 1959) and is of the opinion that he will be a valuable asset.

2. GRRPAIR-15 has located two more cache sites and has spotted an individual who he believes would be a good W/T operator. This person works in GRRPAIR-15's section and used to be a radio man in the German Air Force during World War II. GRRPAIR-15 is compiling background information on this man although he understands that we are not presently interested in recruiting additional W/T operators.

C. Security: Basic security in this area remains very good. There have been no new developments with regard to GRRPAIR-7's association with the suspected Communist in his home town. A minor problem has cropped up concerning GRRPAIR-15 and that is that his Instruct-O-Graph set causes a noticeable disturbance in radio receptions in his apartment building. This situation will be remedied in April when we intend to exchange the Instruct-O-Graph for a "TRIK" recorder.

D. Training: Neither agent received any training during the period. GRRPAIR-15 is presently scheduled to spend eight days in Munich beginning 11 April 1959.

E. Equipment: No change.

F. Administration:

1. GRRPAIR-7 was not paid during the period.
2. GRRPAIR-15 was paid salary (AS 300./month) and expenses through 26 February 1959.

II. Planning:

A. Case Officer hopes to resume GRRPAIR-7's training schedule and to spend a few hours with GRRPAIR-15 discussing purely operational matters.

B. GRRPAIR-15 will receive another week of W/T training from 11 April through 19 April. At this time we hope to introduce him to communications procedures and to his operational equipment.

C. On 14 March 1959 Case Officer will attempt to recruit and test Subject of [] If all turns out well, we will schedule initial training for the earliest possible date. PRQ Part II will be forwarded immediately following recruitment.
