<p><u>SYNOPSIS:</u></p> <p>1. During the week of 16-22 July 1962, GRBERG underwent a tutorial with the 10th Special Forces at Bad Toelz. During this period he was accompanied by [redacted] was billeted in a Gasthaus twenty kilometers from Bad Toelz and was presented (in alias) for training at 0745 at the Bad Toelz range dressed in U. S. Army fatigues. The training was very thorough and will enable GRBERG to function as a contingency GW/UW asset in the event of hostilities.</p> <p><u>NATURE AND SCOPE OF TRAINING:</u></p> <p>2. Following is a day-by-day log of training:</p> <p><u>Monday, 16 July 1962</u></p> <p>0745 - 1700 Weapon's orientation including the disassembly, assembly and firing of the cal. 30 M-1 and the cal. 30 BAR. Home work assigned on Demolition.</p> <p><u>Tuesday, 17 July 1962</u></p> <p>0745 - 1700 Weapon's training as above with the cal. 45 pistol, cal. 30 SM; M-3 and the cal. 30 carbine M-2.</p> <p>1700 - 1900 Demolitions training including the assembly and firing of various forms of demolitions system.</p> <p><u>Wednesday, 18 July 1962</u></p> <p>0745 - 1200 Training in first aid and survival including a conducted tour through a prepared survival demonstration area.</p> <p>1200 - 1700 Additional training in demolition theory.</p> <p>1700 - 2000 Demolitions firing with an emphasis on field expediencies and home-made charges.</p> <p><u>Thursday, 19 July 1962</u></p> <p>0745 - 1700 Air operations including selecting, documenting and servicing DZ's and LZ's. A field trip was taken in the afternoon to several DZ's in the Bad Toelz area.</p> <p>2000 - 2200 Night field exercise in the preparation for and the reception of a night personnel drop. The reception of a four-man team was successfully carried through.</p> <p><u>Friday, 20 July 1962</u></p> <p>0745 - 1200 Training in GW/UW theory and practice in the organization of various nets, the conducting of raids and ambushes, and map reading.</p>

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1300 - 1700 The disassembly, cleaning and re-assembly of all the weapons fired earlier in the week.

1930 - 2200 A night field problem on compass reading.

Saturday, 21 July 1962

0745 - 1200 A field reconnaissance of several different types of bridges in the Bad Toelz area for the purpose of indicating the proper placement of demolition charges.

1200 - GRBERG returned to Munich to pick up his POV, which was in a garage.

EVALUATION OF TRAINING:

3. All the training was given by three very competent NCO's of the 10th Special Forces Group and since it was given as a tutorial a great deal of material and help could be given the student. In general the training was oriented toward making GRBERG a useful active GW/UW asset. A slightly less intensive coverage of the theories and organization of GW will enable him to at least understand the needs, management and planning of a GW unit. GRBERG was given a good deal of practice in the various techniques taught and demonstrated, and in general was handled as a "doer" rather than an organizer.

EVALUATION OF GRBERG'S PERFORMANCE:

4. GRBERG was an apt, conscientious and diligent student. He displayed a strong mechanical aptitude and thus reached a level of proficiency in the handling of weapons and explosives that would enable him to instruct others in these subjects. He at all times followed orders and instructions and caused his instructors no cause for concern about safety or security procedures. He is basically an intelligent young man, and in spite of his limited formal education, displayed a good understanding of all theoretical subjects given him. His S. F. Group instructors expressed their evaluation of him by saying that they would be very happy to have him working with them, if the need ever arose.

PLANS FOR GRBERG'S DISPOSITION:

5.] will next meet with GRBERG 14 September 1962 to complete his training and to arrange for future contact. He will be taught some of the basic techniques of clandestine activities including security, meetings and communications. It is anticipated that this additional training will be completed during the fall, at which time he will be asked to establish a D/L drop for possible wartime use, and he will be given an accommodation address for his future contact with KUBARK. He will be given a termination bonus of six months' salary and be told to expect us to contact him on an annual basis to see if he is still in place. The following fact and incident can be used to establish bona fides with him at some future date: During his week of training he stayed at the "Die Alte Post" Gasthaus in Holzkirchen, and one of his instructor's family came over to Bad Toelz from PBPRIME.

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
