- 36. None assigned.
- 37. Contacted by in January 1957, after had gotten his name, with a recommendation, from Dr. Dolgoi (see question 32). Subject has been a personal acquaintance of since 1950.
- 38. Not yet hired, not now being handled.
- 39. Probably a combination of financial considerations, dissatisfaction with school-teaching, and a desire to take on something new and interesting. The proposed job with has been described to him in general terms only.
- 40. Headquarters, COS/G, BOB, A-2, OSI and CIC, no traces as of January 1957. Berlin Documents Center, January 1957: GRUENWALDT was a member of the Deutsche Volksgemeinschaft in Latvia, became German citizen in Posen on 13 January 1940, joined the A-SS 10 January 1940, # 371 839; served in the W-SS from May 1941 to May 1942 and from 12 March 1944, held rank of SS Untersturmfuehrer as of 1 January 1945; units were SS Artillerie-Ausbildungs-und Ersatz-Regt, Amt B I (Schaedlingsbekaempfung), and Hauptamt Volksdeutsche Mittelstelle (Wirtschaftsbetriebe). German Police January 1957: GRUENWALDT was judged by the Ebersberg Spruchkammer to have been a "Gruppe IV" (lightest degree) Nazi. In June 1953 he applied for an extension of his passport for the purpose of vacation travel to Austria and Holland.

- 42. Thinks now that he is candidate for employment by the organization; if hired, would know he was working for AIS.
- 43. NONE known
- 44. None; would be used to debrief operational contacts.

- 48. If hired, he would be payed a regular salary, precise amount to be determined by BOB.
- 49. No; he has been told he is under consideration for employment.
- 50. Could probably pass as a native German.

53. We have no first-hand knowledge of his character; he is considered by [] who has known him for 7 years, to be a generally desirable type of individual, and was recommended as such by the persons listed in PRQ I as character references.
54. Cannot be judged. He appears generally Western-oriented, not fired by strong ideological motivation to collaborate with any power; his mother's residence in East Germany constitutes a potential element of control by the East.
55. Scientific training (see PRQ I)
56. Not yet available.
57. From questionnaire which he filled out for [] in February 1957, except for question # 25, which was answered on basis of report from Berlin Documents center.

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
