SUBJECT : RAUS Interrogatories

1. I met with RAUS on 7 December 1965 and went over the interrogatories with him in order to be sure that we had identified those questions which have security implications for the Agency. In addition to the ones that you and I had discussed by telephone I discovered that there were several others which could be embarrassing by reason of his association with the AEDEPOT program (now IUDEPOT since its transfer to SOD). In this connection, I had earlier met with [redacted] of IUDEPOT and had brought him up to date on the current status of this case. I have assured him that I would be alert to any possible disclosures which might prove embarrassing by virtue of RAUS's connection with their program.

2. You should be aware that RAUS believes that he is dealing with a Department of Defense outfit in IUDEPOT. In addition, since the training is given under military cover it could presumably be included under a blanket refusal to disclose information concerning his Reserve Officer military training, on the grounds that it is classified and that he is not permitted by reason of a secrecy agreement to disclose such information. The specific questions of concern are as follows:

Question 10: The term "residence" could conceivably be broad enough to cover his period of temporary residence during his IUDEPOT training. This involved a six months course in 1960, a six weeks overseas assignment in 1963, and a regular two week annual period since then.

Questions 32 and 33: He was given a standard physical examination in connection with his IUDEPOT work.

Question 69: He received special training for IUDEPOT.

Questions 154 and 155: He receives a small stipend, something like \$100 a year from IUDEPOT.

Questions 209 through 213: IUDEPOT took out an insurance policy on him and retains it in the project files.

3. RAUS also pointed out to me that questions 80 and 81 gave him trouble since he does know several FBI agents or officers by true name and he is not certain whether he has a right to divulge these names in the interrogatories.
