1. For passage to the RV: Station files show that one Curt HEISEMEYER, born on 27 December 1907, was listed in November 1936, as a member of the SS Ostler (EGOA 170, 8 Nov 58). Information obtained from EGOA 1076, 17 October 1958, indicates that Kurt HEISEMEYER (born 27 December 1907 in Hannover) appeared at the U.S. Consulate in Hannover in early October 1958. According to HEISEMEYER, he was a member of the Nazi Sicherheitspolizei and Sicherheitsdienst in Krakow, Poland, during World War II. He was imprisoned by the Poles on 10 August 1946, and released on 24 July 1958, although he still had at least three years of his sentence to serve. He arrived in Camp Friedland in West Germany on 26 July 1958 and returned to Hannover, his home. Subject claimed that he was asked by four Poles and three Ukrainians with whom he had served in prison to inform "Frankfurt" that the Polish Security Service had the names and photos of all individuals who went through the Frankfurt Installation up to at least 1956. (We cannot confirm this allegation)

2. We have no identifiable traces on Max MUELLER and no traces on the other personalities mentioned in reference.
