1. Hans HERRSCHAFT, a former SS-Untersturmführer and Obersturmführer of the SD, is living at Aschau-Werk, Muhlendorf/Inn. He is reported to have collaborated closely on the work undertaken by Dr. MARCUX in the R.S.U. (a pro-Soviet movement). He further is reported to be vice president of the "Association of Germans of Rumania."

2. At the end of the war, he is alleged to have registered at Munich as a displaced person. At that time, he is reported to have had at his disposal large sums of money acquired from his work for the Rumanian/Siguransa. His wife, a Rumanian citizen, allegedly left her country in 1949 with a great deal of luggage containing considerable gold and jewels.

3. For a while, he reportedly worked with a certain BAUMSCHEN, who claims to be a professor and lives at Munich, Ismaningerstrasse, No. 102 (telephone 48.11.01) for an office of the C.I.D. in Munich. As a displaced person, he allegedly obtained, shortly thereafter, the direction of a brick factory located at Muhlendorf/Inn. Reportedly, he profited from this position to acquire a certain standing among the displaced persons whom he represented. In this connection, he allegedly was received on several occasions by Professor HEUSS and by the president of the federal parliament Herr EHLER.

4. As the firm which he directed allegedly went bankrupt, Subject reportedly decided to return to his work for the Siguransa.
