Dear Mr. Hoover:

In accordance with our understanding regarding cooperation and liaison between the Federal Bureau of Investigation and my Office, as set forth in memorandum enclosed in my letter of 23 September 1948, I wish to advise you that I received information last evening stating that Dr. Gustav Hilger, former Consular Minister of the German Embassy in Moscow, and who has been employed by American military authorities in Germany on secret work, will arrive sometime today at Westover Field on MATS Flight 126-A, Plane Number 9147.

This Office is arranging for Dr. Hilger, who is accompanied by his wife, daughter and two grandchildren - all of whom are German nationals, to be met and forwarded to Washington. The full names of Dr. Hilger's wife, daughter and two grandchildren are not yet known to this Office, but will be forwarded to you as soon as they are obtained, together with other pertinent data. Dr. Hilger and his family are entering the United States on a Section (2) Visitors Visa and may be used for work of other agencies of this government under the jurisdiction of this Office.
