<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Must act as consultant on criminal law, commercial law, and criminology for the Section Chief and other US Military Government authorities;</li> <li>Must supervise the carrying on of all criminal investigations assigned to the Criminal Investigation Sub-Section;</li> <li>Must supervise criminal investigators, briefing them, and giving them specific instructions for making arrests, searches, and/or seizures;</li> <li>Must handle the more complex investigations involving frauds, embezzlements, customs violations, violations of Military Government economic regulations, and other cases considered of particular importance to Military Government;</li> <li>Must interrogate offenders and witnesses in connection with cases enumerated under para 4, take statements, write reports, make recommendations, and prepare cases for judicial disposition;</li> <li>Must conduct investigations of a confidential nature or of special interest to Military Government.</li> </ol> <p><b>QUALIFICATIONS</b></p> <p>The prerequisites enabling efficient fulfillment of the above-mentioned duties include not only a comprehensive knowledge of, understanding of, and experience in the field of criminology, but should also encompass thorough familiarity with criminal law, court procedure, the laws of the Allied Control Council, and those of the Allied Kommandatura.</p> <p>Inasmuch as this position will concern itself mainly with investigations of corruption and fraud, a very thorough knowledge not only of criminal law, but also of commercial law, and of Military Government economic policies is absolutely necessary. The investigator should also have had not only years of experience in these types of investigations, but, because of their extreme technicality and complexity have had formal preparation and training in the way of satisfactory completion of courses in auditing, commercial book-keeping, and commercial law, and criminology.
