When HUMITA came to the U.S., he went to Detroit, Michigan, where he took residence at the home of (Reverend) GEORGE POP. He obtained employment in the Chrysler Motor Factory in Detroit. T-1 advised that about a month and one-half ago, he received a letter from HUMITA. T-1 advised that he was very surprised to receive the letter from HUMITA since they were not on friendly terms. HUMITA had written advising that he desired to obtain information relative to summer courses being given at the Catholic University in the field of Comparative Philology. HUMITA indicated to T-1 that he wanted the information for Reverend POP, a Rumanian professor from the University of Louvain, Belgium, who had been invited as a guest lecturer to the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor, Michigan.

HUMITA also advised in the letter that he had been unemployed for about six months inasmuch as the Chrysler plant had laid off many employees. HUMITA asked T-1 about the possibilities of obtaining employment in Washington, D.C.

T-1 stated that he did not answer HUMITA's letter because he was too busy and because he did not care to correspond with HUMITA.

T-1 advised that he had no knowledge relative to any current Iron Guard activity which HUMITA might be engaged inasmuch as he has not been in close contact with Rumanian emigres since leaving Cleveland two years ago.
