SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

Confidential Informant T-1 advised Subject interned in Rostock Prison Camp, Germany, a stockhold for Iron Guard members, and was reported to have been an Iron Guard member. Subject was alleged to have been one of group who physically beat STEFAN POPESCU, a member of the Mexican faction of Iron Guard. T-1 further advised HUMITA was Detroit outlet for Russian funds coming into U.S.

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DETAILS:

Confidential Informant T-1, of unknown reliability, a self-admitted former charter member of the Rumanian Iron Guard and of the Mexican faction therein, advised on March 27, 1954, that TIBERIU HUMITA was interned at Marienette Slave Labor Camp, Germany, in the summer of 1942. Informant further advised that the Subject was subsequently interned at Buchenwald Concentration Camp, Germany, and was kept in the Rostock Prison Camp within Buchenwald, which was an Iron Guard stronghold where Iron Guard members were kept in contact isolated from other prisoners. He stated that to be allowed within Rostock, one had to have the permission of HORIA SIMA and VIKTOR, the Iron Guard leaders, which permission was granted only through PETRESCA and that entry into Rostock meant automatic present and past membership in the Rumanian Iron Guard.

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Confidential Informant T-2, of unknown reliability, a former member of the Rumanian Iron Guard, advised that TEODOR HUMITA was confined in Rostock and was one of the members of the Iron Guard at Rostock Prison Camp who had physically beaten STEFAN POPESCU, a member of the Iron Guard Mexican faction, following a kangaroo court and torture period in which POPESCU was accused of being anti-NORIA SIMA.

Confidential Informant T-3, of unknown reliability, a former member of the Rumanian Iron Guard, advised that the Mexican Group of which STEFAN POPESCU was a member had formulated a plot to set off a bomb to kill PETRUSCA within Rostock. This plot, according to T-3, was actually an attempt by the government of ANTONESCU in Rumania to kill both PETRUSCA and SIMA in order to split the Iron Guard ranks still further. T-3 stated that the plot failed inasmuch as information concerning it leaked out before it could be perpetrated.

Confidential Informant T-1 advised that TEODOR HUMITA was the Detroit outlet for Russian funds routed to the United States through Spain and Canada.

Confidential Informant T-4, of unknown reliability who is personally acquainted with the Subject, stated that he has no knowledge of the Subject's activities prior to his arrival in the United States about 1951 other than the Subject formerly worked with an unknown refugee organization in Rome, Italy. The informant stated he has never had occasion to discuss politics with the Subject but that the Subject does not go out in the evening and does not belong to any organizations other than the church.

Mr. GEORGE CONSTANTIN, 17808 Orleans, advised that he was acquainted with the Subject through the church which they both belonged to but had no knowledge of the Subject's activities prior to his arrival in the United States nor since his arrival. He stated that their's was only a speaking acquaintance.

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
