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HAGALF REACTION TO MAJ AMIN'S "ESCAPE".

1. The Hagalf held a hurriedly convened meeting on Monday, June 10th, in Tel-Aviv, at which not all members could attend. The discussion was about the new situation created by the then known movements of the Mufti of Palestine, Haj Amin el Husseini. The discussion also centered on the counter-measures the Yishuv should adopt. No solution could be reached, as the Jewish Agency was unable to give definite information as to the exact place to which Haj Amin had moved. The discussions were therefore postponed till the end of the week.

2. In the meantime, beginning at 6 p.m. on Monday, June 10th, emergency regulations in all Haganah centres of the various zones were put into force, and they were informed that the truce between the Palestine Administration and the various resistance forces would come to an end within the next twenty-four hours, special and definite orders to be awaited.

3. In Haganah circles it is believed that within the next fortnight the non-cooperation order for the entire Yishuv will be declared and come into force.

4. An extraordinary meeting of the Vaad Leumi, with representatives of all parties and Jewish bodies, will be called at the beginning of next week, and they are expected to pass the non-cooperation plans which have been planned long back (as outlined in these reports, Ed.).

5. On Monday afternoon it became known in informed circles that the N.M.O. had declared to the Jewish Agency that the truce had ended, and that they would now go over again to the attack of Government.

6. The same evening, at 6 p.m., the Tel-Aviv Haganah headquarters were informed by the N.M.O. of their impending attacks on the railway (which actually took place between 6.45 and 7.15, in which three trains were simultaneously destroyed on three different lines, Ed.). Immediately the Haganah gave orders to eleven Kibbutzim and settlements in the vicinity of the planned attacks to shelter the attackers after their work was done.

7. At 6.15 p.m. all over Tel-Aviv this information was passed around by grapevine news, and the Haganah code order "T.A.P." (stand to order) was given for the Tel-Aviv, Petach-Tiqva and Ben-Shemen areas shortly after 6.30 p.m.

8. This T.A.P. order was extended on Thursday at 11 a.m. to all Haganah zones throughout Palestine.
