



decided to establish a "Palestine Liberation Fund" to be used for achieving Palestine's independence; a "Palestine Liberation Week" will be designated for the collection of funds.

2. A report from another U.S. Agency dated 19 March 1958 stated that Husayni, now a resident of Cairo, announced on 16 March that his Palestine Arab Government formed in 1948 in Gaza is still the legitimate government of all Palestine and wishes to join the UAR. On 4 April 1958 the Associated Press reported that the Gaza Legislative Council passed unanimously a resolution calling for membership in the UAR. On or about 17 May 1958 the Associated Press reported that Gaza's Legislative Council announced on 15 May the formation of a Palestine National Union. TDCS-3/369,111, date of information late August 1958, reported that if King Husayn left Jordan or was removed by a popular uprising 'Abd-al-Nasir would seek the following: that West Jordan and Gaza form an Arab Palestine state with borders guaranteed by the Arab League and the United Nations; this state would not be committed to join UAR in any form.
