SUBJECT: ICEBERG and SES-128A: Recapitulation and Clarification

ICEBERG covers a general Austrian operation involving training of stay-behind operators, burial of equipment, and signal plans and ciphers. A little confusion has originated from an overlapping Washington-born project, SES-128A. Hereafter, SES-128A will be identified with ICEBERG.

ICEBERG involves:

- 1. Agent [redacted], trained and equipped with two TR-1's plus one power supply. Plan BLUMEN and ciphers are being held for him.

Agent [redacted] - final report on training not in files, set delivered to [redacted] or him. Plan OBST being held for him.

COMMENTS:

1. The allocation of only one set to [redacted] and the plan to allocate only one each to [redacted] and [redacted] is contrary to Communications policy so long as we can safely furnish two sets each, as we still can.

2. Completely satisfactory replies to such messages as Vien 1973 (IN 12862) cannot be prepared until such time as we can foresee a firm basis for stay-behind signal plans, that is, until we are assured of a safer base or some safer basis of contact than LIMBER.
