his turnover to the [ ] Station whereby he has been unable to contact his case officer and has known for some time that a replacement officer would be coming. The personal relationship between agent and case officer, however, has been good. On the basis of a three month association [ ] is very optimistic as to the ultimate value of A/15 to Station operations. He is a self-generating type, and it is probable that he will keep his next case officer busy with operational planning.

IDENTITY A

Jakabs \*SILIS (Born circa 1905, presumably in Latvia; Soviet citizen; prior to 1940 a professional officer in the Latvian Army, in the Signal Corps; during World War II was a Captain in the Latvian Legion and fought with the Germans against the Soviet Army; served with the 15th Division of the Legion and captured by the Soviets in 1945 with remnants of the division on the Hela peninsula; deported to Siberia by the Soviets and subsequently returned to Latvia, probably since 1957; presently a radio engineer with the Popov Factory, Riga, Latvia).

IDENTITY B

Erika \*SVARCS (Soviet citizen; presumably anti-Communist; resides at Karla Marksa iela 10/12, Dz. 2, Riga, Latvia, USSR).
