4. REPORT OF INCIDENT

On 8 November 1958 Ibola Kalman, born 26 April 1916 in Budapest, Hungary, currently residing at Grassgma 279, Land Salzburg, Austria, was interviewed in the German language through Informant 3787 at her residence. The interview was conducted in compliance with DF, dated 29 September 1958, Subject as above, which instructs that Ibola Kalman be interviewed regarding KAUDER-KLATT's alleged NATO activities. Substantially the following information was obtained:

Ibola Kalman stated that she first met KAUDER-KLATT during the winter of 1948 when she was employed as a dancer in a cabaret in Sofia, Bulgaria, and that she and KAUDER-KLATT have celebrated since. When questioned as to her knowledge of KAUDER-KLATT's activities on behalf of the German government at that time, Kalman admitted that she was aware that KAUDER-KLATT was working for the Abwehr but that she did not know exactly what his duties or activities were. When questioned as to KAUDER-KLATT's current activities in Salzburg, she stated that his time was occupied almost entirely with the management of his business, the KEMA firm, located at Schanzstrasse 30, Salzburg. Kalman further stated that, as far as she knew, KAUDER-KLATT has no definite political sympathies and that he belonged to no political organizations. After further questioning, Kalman stated that she was sure that KAUDER-KLATT was not employed by NATO as an intelligence agent and that the article in the Salzburger Nachrichten of 19 September 1958, was a mere fabrication designed to injure him. Kalman expressed the opinion that KAUDER-KLATT must have an enemy on the Salzburg police force who gave the story to the press, but she allegedly did not know who this enemy might be. (7-4)

Agent's Notes: During the interview Ibola Kalman was very cooperative, though a trifle tense at times. She claimed that her first hint of KAUDER-KLATT's present predicament came when she read the article about him in the Salzburger Nachrichten of 19 September 1958. It is believed that Kalman was telling the truth in so far as she knows it, but that KAUDER-KLATT probably does not completely confide in her as to the nature and extent of all his activities.
