Does it strike you that in obtaining subject stay-behind types, selected Germans who during their PW years were given training in democratic principles in PW camps in the United States could be utilized? We realize there is some security implication, in that such Germans might be suspect to a future occupier. However, thousands of men received such training, and the individuals possibly would not be subjected to such a searching scrutiny, as say, Wehrmacht soldiers who fought on the Eastern Front in World War II.

2. If you think there is any merit to the idea, perhaps you could forward a list of names and addresses of such people. We have made a disguised query of HICOG and they advise the desired information is available in the German Documents Center, Alexandria, Virginia.
