<p>1. The following is an excerpt from a lengthy discourse which Ferenc TASNADI-KOVACS prepared for ZACAGE. This story is not particularly illuminating or consequential; it does however, underscore the endless ramifications of Zipper's relations with General Andras ZAKO and his colleagues:</p> <p>In the summer of 1948, I was directed to break with Gen. ZAKO because he was absorbed in political activities and his colleagues, Miklos KORPCNAY was not trustworthy. (KORPONAY was dropped from the ZAKO group this year.) Shortly after I dropped contact with the ZAKO group, Gen. ZAKO invited me to a special conference in Munich. At this time ZAKO informed me that he had found an important German in the organization who was willing to pay \$1,500 to \$2,000 per month provided that ZAKO turn over all his contacts. In this connection, ZAKO mentioned the following Hungarian information leaders: <u>Georg KOLLENYI</u> in Graz, Janos CZIKELY in Salzburg and Graz, Laszlo ESZENYI in Munich, Istvan ZAKO and my own group.
