14. <p>As found out by means of a new source, Michail CORZAN claims to be managing a group of Orthodox Poles at present which he himself estimates at 500 persons; formerly, he was a priest in Cracow and Lemberg.</p> <p>When LUEDKE was making his propaganda trip to Duesseldorf and Essen, he was being accompanied by CORZAN. He spoke to a group of Poles there. When speaking to strangers, he always underscores that he is an Anti-Bolshevik and emigrant supporting the "peace action" only ideally, but nevertheless in contact with PFALLER, secretary of the "National Peace Committee".</p> <p>On 5 April 51, the old source called on CORZAN who continued to play the same tricks with him which were reported in F No. 7003. He offered to the source a collaboration with his intelligence activities.</p> <p>He showed Soviet propaganda brochures, directed against the Americans which he claimed to have received from the Soviet Zone. CORZAN furthermore inquired about the remittance of 300 DM (F No. 7003) to the source and proposed to provide the source with Communist brochures suggesting that he should tell the leader of his group he had stolen them from him, CORZAN.</p> <p>He also suggested to introduce the collaborator to Communist circles which, as he said however, were closed circles and would check the source. most carefully. After such investigation the work could begin which here, i.e., in West Germany, was very risky. During the talk, K. proved that he was fully informed about the Ukrainian matters at Dachauerstrasse 9.</p> <p>On 11 April, this source called upon CORZAN once more. He suggested to the source to work for him for 400 DM per month plus additional unexpected expenditures. For this purpose, he will put the source in touch with a Russian who will arrive from Stuttgart and instruct him about the manner in which he is to work. The source, upon agreement, is to travel to various places in the Western Zone. C. promised to inform him about the arrival of the person in question.</p> <p>²On 13 April, the source did not find C. at home. The landlady, Mrs. HASENAU, said that C. had left in the morning, accompanied by a certain Dr. KOWAK or KOWAKI (name taken from reference of landlady). Mrs. CORZAN was not present.</p>

Around 11 o'clock, the mail man brought a money order from which the source could learn that C. was receiving 2,000RM per mail from Stuttgart from a certain V. BARANOV. Mrs. HASENAU commented to the effect that money orders like this were being sent to Prof. CORZAN quite often.</p> <p>Ukrainian circles report that CORZAN is known in Volhynia under the name CORZE. He remained in Poland under the Soviets in 1939, was a teacher there. He had the reputation to be easily bought.</p>					
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
