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

SUBJECT: List of secretaries who worked in Abwehrstelle III in Cracow.

1. It should be kept in mind that circa 200 officers, NCO's, civilians and secretaries worked for Abwehrstelle III in Cracow. I am unable to furnish any information whatsoever on any of these individuals ~~neither~~ because my work did not bring me in contact with any of them. The Ukrainian anti-Bolshevik section of Abwehrstelle III in Cracow was located in a separate office and had employees who were separate from those mentioned above. Our section dealt only with an section, that headed by Lt. Col. Franz von TARBUK, of Abwehrstelle III; later Major Franz von KORAB replaced TARBUK.

2. One of the two secretaries working our section was Olena VARANYTSYA. She was circa twenty years of age at that time. VARANYTSYA was the daughter of an old Ukrainian emigrant father, who originated from the village of Dolyna in Western Ukraine, and of a Viennese mother. She was graduated of a commercial school and had taken special course in stenography and typing. Her father died in the 1930's; VARANYTSYA resided in Vienna with her mother, older sister and younger brother until her arrival in Cracow. VARANYTSYA knew the German, Ukrainian and Polish languages; she also had a passing acquaintance with the English and Russian languages. She was responsible for typing all reports which our section sent to Lt. Col. TARBUK's office.

3. Doris REIZNER, of German extraction, was the second secretary in our section. At that time she was circa 22 years of age; she originated from Shlesk (sic) where her father served as Lieutenant in the German shutspolizei. In 1941 REIZNER had been mobilized into the Luftwaffe Nachrichtenhelferin; she joined our section in either 1942 or 1943 after having received her separation from the Luftwaffe. She knew the German and French languages and was partially acquainted with the Polish language. She was both a stenographer and a typist.

4. On 17 January 1945 our section was evacuated to Prague. On this date REIZNER received her separation from the section and is believed to have joined her father in Shlesk. I have had no contact with her since that time. When I moved to Munich from Austria in 1947, my colleague Yaroslav ROMANYUK, who is now in the United States, informed me that he had met Doris REIZNER in Munich in the fall of 1946. REIZNER was searching for her parents with whom she had lost contact; she remained in Munich only briefly from where she departed to Hamburg. Yaroslav ROMANYUK has had no contact with her since then.

5. I saw Olena VARANYTSYA for the last time on 15 April 1945 in Prague. ~~It~~ that she departed to the Moravian ostrava (sic) to an acquaintance of Major KORAB. Major KORAB himself departed for the same destination on 16 April 1945. I had no contact with her since that time.

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6. Maria ~~LEBESKI~~ aka ~~LEBESKI~~ was one of two secretaries who worked in the office of Lt. Col. TARBUK, later that of Major KORAB. She was circa 32 years of age at that time and originated from Eastern Prussia. In 1943 she married a Germany army NCO (nu). ~~LEBESKI~~, who was the chief secretary in TARBUK's office, left Cracow in December 1944.

7. ~~Wanda~~ (lma) was the second secretary in TARBUK's office. She was circa 30 years of age at that time, and had reddish hair and was stocky. She originated from the vicinity of Stuttgart. She left Cracow in December of 1944 from which time neither I nor any of my friends have heard of her.
