1. In time of war Subject should be moved to an area occupied by this group and could be used as interrogator of Russian, Ukrainian, Polish Csech and Slovak individuals. He also can be used as spotter and recruiter of informants and other types. A preliminary assessment of Subject indicates the possibility that he could be used to some extent in PP activity. He should be assimilated into a military group as quickly as possible.
2. Other than peripheral briefing and guidance, none.
3. NA
4. If redeployment means transfer of Subject to an American occupied base, there will exist requirements such as possible quartering in a safehouse (temporarily), movement from this area to another "black," possible operational documentation.
5. Case files on Subject appear to be complete insofar as concerns his biography, operational use and American handlers. There appears to be an ample supply of records concerning Subject's friends, relatives and another agent who knows that Subject is employed with this base.
6. Earlier talks with Subject on the topic of future utilization of him by this organization indicate a strong willingness on his part to contribute all that he can in the effort against Sovietism. Subject on one occasion apologized for "giving the appearance of being a coward" but does not desire to be used in a dangerous mission, interpreted by him as follows: dispatch into deep enemy territory either via parachute or overland. Otherwise, he is prepared to enter into any other venture.
