MEMORANDUM FOR: The Record

SUBJECT: Contact Report - Koszorus

1. On Wednesday, October 8 the undersigned met Koszorus at the California Kitchen, 1234 Connecticut Ave. Koszorus seemed in much better health and his attitude also was better. He explained that he was working without pay in a sign painter's shop to learn the business and that his wife had made a poster advertisement which they planned to circulate among the Hungarians in America to solicit business in the sign painting and poster field.

2. He received his salary for September, which with the offset of \$78 from his gardening job, amounted to \$308.64. He explained that he had received a letter from the Hungarian American Relief requesting repayment of a \$100 debt, and that with the payment of his rent coming due, he would be short of funds by the end of the month. He again requested that we reimburse him for the expenses of bringing his family from the West Coast. It was explained to him that such reimbursement was unlikely, but that "I would see what could be done."

3. There was practically no conversation about the development of the Veterans Organization.
