1. RENAULT was visited again on the evening of 28 March 1947 by AB-52, AB-46, and ZIGZAG.

EXTRACT:

1. On Friday, 4 April 1947, ZIGZAG visited subject to receive the answer given by the French IS on the suggestion that American intelligence authorities be kept informed of the reports Subject supplies to French. The French, subject stated, had naturally refused.

2. When ZIGZAG declared that it was too bad, Subject hesitated. ... After some minutes he declared that if the French would never find out about his collaboration, he would be willing. ZIGZAG gave the proper assurances and RENAULT declared himself ready to work.

3. RENAULT immediately told ZIGZAG of 2 Russian hldg's projects in SIBERIA. 2 giant hydrogenation plants are to be constructed to supply Pacific coast air bases with fuel. Claims 300 engineers are working on the project in BERLIN. Promised to supply carbon copies of these reports to Americans.

4. RENAULT impresses ZIGZAG well. Made no demands and had no wishes. Expressed hope that sometime later he would be told how the Americans had become aware of his activities.

5. ZIGZAG, who will continue to be the cutout in dealing with RENAULT is using the cover name HANSEN in these dealings.
