SUBJECT: Loss of USAF ACIC Building Entry pass (badge).

1. I lost my Guam Hall entry badge this morning, 11 Feb. 1957, between 0700 and 0740. I fixed the badge to my jacket before leaving my living place, at 1706, 25-th Street, S.E. I noticed the loss when opening my overcoat in Guam Hall, to show the badge to the guard. I walked all the way from my living place to the office, taking the 25-th Street, Pennsylvania Avenue, Sousa bridge, 17-th Street, Potomac Avenue, 19-th Street, Constitution Avenue, 21-st Str. and the back-entrance (of the cars) to Guam Hall premises.
2. I think that I could have lost the badge on the Potomac Ave, between 18-th and 19-th Streets, on the right sidewalk, where I reached into my pocket for a pencil. (I had been preparing myself for the Map Reading Course during ~~the~~ last night and was now using the opportunity to check my own "pacing".)
3. After having noticed the loss I traced the same way twice, looking for the lost badge, but did not find it.
4. Thereafter I reported the loss in the Security Office of Guam Hall. The report was transmitted in my presence to the Security Office of the "Midway" building.
