1. Reference is made to your memorandum dated 25 July 1960 wherein a covert security approval was requested to permit the Subject's utilization under Project AEJAMMER. Subject is to be employed as a full time analyst and translator to exploit intercepted Soviet mail for intelligence purposes and to perform short term research projects based primarily on materials intercepted in the field. Subject will share the AEJAMMER office with the seven present occupants and will use the same cover, U.S. Army, as is being currently used by the other contract employees of AEJAMMER.
2. In accordance with the provisions set forth in Clandestine Services Instruction No. 10-5 and Clandestine Services Instruction Field No. 10-5, a covert security approval is granted for the use of the Subject, as described in your request as set forth in paragraph 1, above. It is understood that coordination will be effected with SR/DOB and SR/4 prior to the utilization of the Subject.
3. Subjects of covert security approvals are not to represent themselves as, nor are they to be represented as, employees of CIA.
4. Your attention is called to the fact that a covert security approval does not constitute complete compliance with the provisions of CIA Regulation 10-210. Therefore, if you should desire at a later date to change the status or use of this individual, a request for approval to cover any proposed change should be submitted to this office.
5. This approval becomes invalid in the event the Subject's services are not utilized within six months of the date of this memorandum.
