Courses for Intelligence Officers, in Tallinn, Estonian in 1932.

Foreign languages:

Estonian, Russian and German - fluent.
French was fluent but is partly forgotten now.
Finnish and Polish - fair.

Honors:

From Military Academy, Technical Branch - best graduate, class 1926.
A golden watch with appropriate engravings was donated.

Decorations: One Estonian and eight from different foreign governments received
between 1935 and 1940. Two German decorations received during WW II.

Work experience:With U.S. Army.

From Sep 1951 up to date. In the beginning in West Germany and since February 1953 in Washington, D.C., with some TDY tours abroad.
Translation and evaluation of different documents and writings from/in Estonian, Finnish, French, German and mainly Russian languages.

With I.R.O. (International Refugee Organization)

From Nov 1949 up to Sep 1951 in Wentorf, Germany. Clerk bilingual with U.S. Resettlement and Immigration Center.

With U.N.R.R.A (United Nations Refugee Relief Agency)

From 1946 up to Sep 1949 consecutively in three Displaced Persons Camps at Draghan, Stotzenau and Lingen, all in the British Zone, Germany.
First as clerk-interpreter, later manager of Camp Office and simultaneously member or chairman of Camp Committee.

With "I.G. FARDEN Industrie", Berlin, Germany.

From Aug 1940 up to June 1941. Industrial research concerning Soviet Union.

With TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY, Tallinn, Estonia.

From 1938 up to 1939. Lecturer in para-military education: communications techniques and tactics (a job held simultaneously with the military service).

Military service:

Estonian Army: Aug 1923 - July 1940.

1923 - 1926: attending Military Academy, in Tallinn.
 1926 - 1929: in field of communications. The last position held: Chief of Communications, First Inf. Division.
 1929 - 1932: attending Advanced College of War, in Tallinn.
 1932 - 1933: in Department of Defense, J 1 (here J 3 - Operations), Tallinn.
 1933 - 1934: Deputy Chief of Operations, First Inf. Division, in Rakvere.
 1934 - 1940: in Department of Defense, J 2 (Intelligence and Information). The last position held: Chief Section "A" (Intelligence West and Information), since 1939 simultaneously Deputy Chief, J 2.
 Simultaneously to these positions: Lecturer in the Technical University and at the Courses for Communications Officers, both in Tallinn.

July 1940: Removed from J 2 on orders of the Soviet occupants because unwilling to co-operate with them as a secret agent. Fled to Germany.

German Army: Aug 1940 - May 1945.

1940 - 1941: Simultaneous work with the Military Intelligence and the "I.G. FARBEW INDUSTRIE" in Berlin. Preparations for war with the Soviet Union and for liberation of Estonia.
 1941 - 1944: With the Military Intelligence and in close co-operation with the Finnish Military Intelligence in Helsinki, Finland, later in Tallinn, Estonia. Position: A Finnish officer detached to the German Mil. Intelligence.
 Aug-Sep '44: Estonian liaison officer to German High Command in Estonia, up to German retreat from Estonia.
 Oct '44-May '45: With the Military Intelligence in Germany. Preparatory work for future reliberation of Estonia.
 May '45-Aug '46: POW of the British in Germany.

Other activities and experiences:

Research work in military and political history concerning the participation of Estonians in WW II against the communists, and the communist atrocities in Estonia. The research started as a hobby in 1946. It continues.

Managerial work during many years and at present as Deputy National Commander of the Legion of Estonian Liberation in USA and President of the Central Association of Estonian Officers in USA.
