SPECIFIC Progress Report - Subject A of BRLN 8752 }

Action Requested: Cancellation of Request for OA. See paragraph 4 below.

SUMMARY: Subject was met at Stuttgart on 26 April 1957. She was debriefed on current developments and informed of our desire to turn her case over to the German Authorities. She agreed to meet her new contact and was briefed for a takeover meeting.

1. Developments since Last Meeting: As reported in para 5c of the Reference, Subject received instructions to proceed to Hettingenbeuren, Kreis Buchen, on 16 April 1957. On that date Subject and children in her car driven by Herbert ~~OLSH~~OLSHIEWSKI (identified in para 1c of Ref) travelled to that location. Upon arrival at the Erholungsheim they were politely informed that there had been an error in their assignment whereupon they returned to Ulm on the same date.

On the following day, 17 April, the Ulm authorities confirmed that through an error they had been sent to Hettingenbeuren. However, as compensation for the inconvenience caused Subject she was assured that every effort would now be made to permanently settle her in the area of her personal choice, namely Heidelberg. Accordingly, on 26 April Subject was advised by Stuttgart authorities that she would be moved to Heidelberg and not Hettingenbeuren, possibly as early as the first week in May.

With reference to Subject's car, she has decided to sell it at a heavy loss if necessary, as she now sees no way of meeting the balance of payments due. It is very possible that she hoped that the Case Officer would continue to make the payments until she established herself.

2. KRAJEWSKI: Though she has written in response to K's first and thus far only letter to her, she has not had any further word from him. She could not offer any explanation for the discrepancy in the dates of K's letter, as elaborated on in para 1g of Reference. She concluded that either K made an error in his listing of dates, or that it is a deliberate attempt to further confuse and thus complicate the operation.

3. Instructions for Turnover to UPSWING: Subject was informed of our desire to turn her over to the German authorities and she readily agreed to this action. It was not necessary to go into any elaborate explanation as to our basis for this action, nor did she seem to be upset or disturbed because of our decision to terminate our relationship. She expressed regret at the change but understood our position.

She was shown copies of the Einlieferungscheins, (para 5 of Reference) the originals of which were sent to her previously via mail. She was informed that her new contact would display the duplicates as a means of recognition upon contact in the near future. Additionally, she was told that her new contact would know the name of her present case officer. The cover name is set forth in the S/C Attachment hereto.

Subject promised to communicate her new address to the case officer in the event she moves before being contacted by the UPSWING representative. For the record, Subject was not told the identity of the German Service concerned.

4. Headquarters Action: In view of the above it is requested that our request for OA contained in EGBA 39714 be cancelled.
