Subject: Summary of [] Case

Para. 3. Victor Alexandrevich LARIONOV (DOB: 13 July 1897, POB: St. Petersburg), aka SCHULTZ:

Subject [] reported that he had met LARIONOV several years ago and that LARIONOV has maintained contact with him over the years. LARIONOV had admitted to Subject that he is an agent for UPSWING. (Comment: MOB has many traces on LARIONOV and many reported suspicions that he is in the employ of UPSWING.) LARIONOV warned Subject several days ago to be careful of [] since he is a "dangerous man." He further told Subject that [] is "most likely" a double agent run by the RIS and controlled by "some Western Intelligence Agency other than UPSWING." UPSWING has much data on [] and he does not constitute any threat in the West. LARIONOV continued by saying that the dangerous one to watch is Mrs. [] She allegedly was a staffer for SMERSH during World War II and is most likely a high-level agent for the RIS at present. Her clandestine activities are most likely unknown to her husband. She is quite clever woman who it has been impossible to expose and who has been a mystery to UPSWING for a good many years. Subject's relationship vis-à-vis LARIONOV has been social. The latter does not pump Subject for information about the emigres and Subject considers himself as NOT being an informant for UPSWING.
