Dear Viktor,

Probably you were waiting for the periodicals which you had ordered and which did not come. The fact is that I was in Tegel, but failed to find a certain "father" and ordered the periodicals from another gentleman (I know him slightly). He wrote down my address and promised to send these things to me. However, again nothing happened! Truly, I am embarrassed. Everything turned out in a typical "Russian" fashion. These are your people.

How are things going with you? Were you in Paris? Was the exhibit of your young brothers interesting? You, of course, are more interested in the Parisian women! You have not been able to get to Berlin yet.

Everything is quiet here. Some British Lord has complained that the Berlin people live too well. In his opinion they never lived so well as after the 13th of August. What should one say to that?

I may possibly go to West Germany this year, but I am not sure yet.
