Promised to meet A/1 to discuss his assignment within a day or two. Usual commo through office phone.

To think over the possibility of remaining here (in the United States) on assignment for a year or so.

B. (Any action required of Case Officer)

2. Check if A/1's wife could be employed as a dentist in Germany.
3. Query branch chief and field re; cancelling A/1's overseas assignment.

SECRET

1. I told A/1 that we had received an answer from the field on his assignment. They want him to come, but there is disagreement about the exact type of job. I told him that basically what we had in mind was a job similar to that held by [ ] when he was in Germany.

2. A/1 said that his wife had flatly refused to go abroad with him, so that if he does accept the assignment it would do serious damage to his domestic life. He said that personally he would like to go, but his wife does not want to throw away her hard work at dental school. A/1 added that his bargaining position with his wife is now weak because she has been offered a \$12,000 a year dental position in Oil City, Pennsylvania. She plans to take her Pennsylvania State Board exams in dentistry in June.

3. A/1 also said that another factor affecting his going overseas is the fact that he has considerable debts here. Although he did not say exactly for what these obligations were incurred, the C/O surmises that they may be in relation to his wife's dental education, etc. A/1 wanted to know what his salary would be overseas, i.e. would he receive more. I answered that I could not make any definite commitments before studying the situation further, but that it is normal that quarters be furnished.

4. I told A/1 that we were not unconditionally ordering him to go overseas, but that I wanted to weigh his desires in making the final decision. He said that in view of the new aspects that I had presented he would like to consider a few days more. I promised to find out more definitely his possibilities in the U.S.

C/O Comment: It is my definite impression that A/1's wife has given him an ultimatum, as he said, at 40 years old have much time left to begin a career in dentistry. If A/1 goes overseas he will go by himself with the resultant bad effects on his marriage and home. ~~Scarcely~~ When I suggested that we might help him find another job in another part of the country if his wife wished to set up practice there, he said that he wished to make a lifetime career of intelligence. He added that if he were to be stationed in the Washington area, his wife would set up practice here. I told him that we expected permanent employees to be reasonably mobile. He said that he realized that, but didn't see how he could go overseas for at least a year without seriously jeopardizing his marriage.

I believe that since we do not (and cannot get clearance) to send him to Germany for active operations as FBI wishes and that SR/6 [ ] is only lukewarm about taking him for Project AEROPLANE in RUB, we should attempt to place him in either SR/6 for translating intercepts or, preferably, with DOB as an AEREBY instructor. He personally would prefer the latter.
