- [] a) Delivered index cards and office supplies to the safehouse []
b) Discussed with agents any new developments they might have heard about
None reported.
c) Delivered [] salary to him
d) Picked up Churgin's work on the telephone directory
e) Inquired if by going over the Soviet Latvian newspapers they have come
across more articles about AECOB surfacings. None reported.
[] : Reported that everything seems to be going as smoothly at M adrid as
possible under circumstances. No new major developments there
[] will continue translating the weekly broadcast summaries.
Due to the fact that [] had written to him and indicated that
she had been in contact with somebody (Possibly Sov. lat.), and by
coordinating this with Joe Yukaitas, [] was informed that George
Vidmonds was the Sov. Latvian who is in Belgium. [] was informed
about this in private and was instructed not to reveal it to Churgin.
[] had no knowledge of Vidmonds as an individual. [] had
indicated that her contact [] (True name []) was coming back to
USA for a short period of time. [] indicated that this is so and that
somebody else will take his [] place while he is absent.
[] instructed [] to translate the parts of [] letter which
are of operational nature
