

Subject: Hugo's Family going to Frankfurt.

Hugo's letter dated March 5, 1959, received in Washington March 9, 1959. Hugo writes in his letter that life without his family is miserable, and does not see any reason why not bring his family over. His wife is not doing well in her profession. She had a hard time lately, the boy had almost drowned, they all were sick, there were snow storms e.t.c. Hugo and his wife have definitely decided that his family should be brought over to Germany.

Hugo mentions, that my wife and I should go to see her and encourage her, because she is morally down with all her failures. He also asks me to find out a good Moving Co. which could take care of their belongings in order to pack things and transport over to Germany. He asks me to take care about their ~~XXXX~~ lease on their home the family is living in. The lease has been signed for one year. Hugo asks me to contact some of the Latvians in Lancaster, who could help her in her problems, because she does not have any ~~XXXXXX~~ whom she knows there.
