Personally, let me herewith include my most cordial greetings to the excellent team of the Armed Forces Special Network which operated in Germany 1957-59, and was the best source of joy of life and gentle Americanization. I'm more sad than it's proper in such a case not to have lived up to their expectations and standards.
