NY T-1, another governmental agency which conducts security type investigations, advised in December, 1964, that the subject was considering repatriation to Latvia.

On March 14, 1966, NY T-2, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that his records reflected that the subject was residing at 202 West 107th Street, Manhattan, New York City, having moved to that address from 250 West 94th Street, Manhattan, New York City, on January 22, 1966.

On July 1, 1966, at approximately 5:09 p.m., a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation observed the subject entering the Soviet Mission to the United Nations (SMUN), 136 East 67th Street, New York City. The subject carried a black briefcase. At 5:13 p.m., the subject was observed by the same Special Agent exiting the SMUN and carrying a black briefcase. Upon exiting the SMUN, the subject proceeded west on 67th Street toward Lexington Avenue, New York, New York.
