Dear Dr. Kissinger:

There is being transmitted to you by the Director this special Top Secret document entitled, "The Threat of Soviet-Bloc Espionage in the United States." It will be deeply appreciated if you will rigidly restrict the knowledge of and reading of this document to yourself, Colonel Haig, and Mr. Ash. When the three of you have finished with it, I would also appreciate your having it returned to me by our Liaison Agent, Mr. Robert H. Haynes.

This is the first part of a two-part transmittal of special and extremely sensitive material which I hope will help you to develop a more detailed understanding of our intelligence capacity to be of assistance to you in discharging your enormously complex, extensive, and heavy responsibilities.

If you have no objection, it would be helpful to me (and I hope to you) if I sent you a strictly personal note of this kind occasionally should the need for such arise.
