1. Andrew Szinay was interviewed 19 July 1951. Szinay has worked with General Zako in the MEEK organization since the war. He, with his wife and eight year old daughter, came to the US in 1949 as IP's, and he plans to apply for US citizenship.

2. Prior to his departure from Europe, his activities in the organization were primarily connected with the underground part of the operation. He is now General Zako's authorized representative in the US, and receives orders from, and reports directly to him.

3. The leader of the US branch of the organization is Dr. Laslo Agh, whose activities are entirely overt, and who has no connection with the underground activities. Agh's deputy is Huny Martonfalvy, who has complete charge of US membership files and records. There are approximately 2000 members in the US, formed into groups in various cities where there is a concentration of Hungarians.

4. Martonfalvy, a former Hungarian officer, works as a chauffeur for Mr. Harrison Lewis, Foreign Service Officer, State Department. Lewis knew him in Europe and knew of his connection with MEEK, and was instrumental in bringing him to this country. Through Martonfalvy, Lewis has been informed of General Zako's desire to establish contacts in the US Government and has offered to bring the matter to the attention of the appropriate Government officials. (Lewis is on a UN assignment, and his address is 2 Park Avenue, New York). Szinay is under the impression that both State and CIA will get information from Lewis on the MEEK activities and plans.



Information Notes

about the viewpoints and activities of the Hungarian
Military Resistance Movement (Magyar Hadosok Hatalma-
i Mozgalmaza (MHBK) (Hungarian Movement))

1. The MHBK (in English: Comradeship of Hungarian Veterans (CHV)) has been formed exclusively for the liberation of Hungary and for the fight against the Bolshevist oppression. Only this is carried out at present and nothing else. We don't deal with politics as our members are recruited from every political party (except Communists). We don't recognize any racial or religious difference and so have among our members a high number of Jews.

Only dishonest people are excluded from our ranks, whose activities are harmful in our work. We want to concentrate our national powers fully for the fight and we have achieved this goal in 100 per cent.

2. In case of war we shall activate instantly our fighting formations in the west and at home in occupied Hungary. That is the reason why the general staff and the staff of the Central Leader don't leave Europe and especially the frontier zone of our country.

We take up the fight in every possible way. If the West does want to help us we will accept that with deep appreciation, if it doesn't we will go ahead with our own means; we will fight with our "teeth and nails" but we will fight the Bolshevism as long as we live.

3. After the liberation immediately the free and unrestricted will of our nation has to be assured. It is for the Hungarian People to decide how it wants to direct the future. The people will have to decide about the would be form of state, the form of its government and about all the various forms of its political life.

We want to be until this very minute the guard of the law, order and security for everyone. We will prevent with every possible means an outbreak of the mob's rage after the collapse of the Bolshevist regime. We can assure that only through our organs it will be prevented in Hungary.

Up to the start of the democratic and constitutional life we want Western Liaison Organs to all of our various formations, to be eyewitnesses of the events, that Hungary will enter the free

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people of the world worthy to the eternal laws of the dignity,
lawful order and democratic freedom.

After this our role will end. The regular army will remain the lawful implement of the executive power as in every state in the West. It will be subordinated to the government. We did not have in the past and will not have in the future the German type of militarism. Our ex-regular-soldier members will join the future army, while the non-regulars will return to their civilian life. The elderly people will live as retired persons and could join the work of Veterans Organizations such as the MHS (CHV) could enter the Hungarian history as a glorious part of the Exile-past. And I should prevent any attempt that would fade its past with the immense moral resources.

4. The Hungarians with German origin who have been expelled from the common country and wish to return voluntarily could also find their own place in our liberation fight. Regarding this we are in touch with them. The number of these willing people for armed services is between 15 and 40,000. Feeling the necessity of a union with the Hungarians under the national tricolor, they are with us up to their hearts' desire.

5. Present activities:

a.) Organisatory work in the "free" part of the world.

b.) Secret work.

To sub-paragraph a.).... The work of the MHS (CHV) is commonly known.

To sub-paragraph b.)....

Counter intelligence (defensive) work in the "free" world.

It covers especially the Occupational Zones in Europe, but works throughout the whole free world. The results are kept recorded at the Central Leader's HQ. In this field the possible closest co-operation is established with the occupying military or governmental authorities concerned.

Offensive work.

The resistance work and movement in Hungary organized in Hungary unceasingly and permanently. A special territory of that is a preparatory work for sabotage actions.

The intelligence is extended in military (Hungarian and Russian) political (the Hungarian Communist Party and reactions); economic (industrial plants, traffic, etc.) fields. Geographically we cover: the whole Hungary, Transylvania and through that a part of Romania (we closely co-operate with the Romanians), a part of Czechoslovakia and the path to Russia.

Results: the Hungarian order of battle at any time, a clear picture of the occupying Russian forces, full and complete control of troop moves, airtel's checks, de-codification of coded messages, for that latter one we have a separate group. The propaganda part of this interception work, mainly secret coded messages of the Hungarian Police, are passed on to the Broadcasting Service of the Free Europe Inc. The particulars of our POW's Service are passed on too so the broadcasting service in this field is based on our information.

6. Co-operation with foreign powers. This is build up on the possibilities and datas. The occupying powers use our agents which is fully approved by us. But the works for various powers are strictly separated from each other.

We receive the most cordial and harmonical support from the French. They offer movement facilities and supply us with travel documents.

The loosest connection is the American one. But this is not our fault. I took every possible chance to build up a direct connection. A direct connection, not through the Germans, because we do not want to be a "Hilfsvolk." Our intentions to establish a close co-operation has been crossed before the US authorities both, by the Germans and Communist ex-collaborationists.

Owing to these I do not see any possibility of a co-operation until I have a personal contact with an expert who would be able to see personally our work on the spot.

Personally I have made up to now the following efforts:
In the fall of 1947: through the German ex-Colonel (GS) Gerold. (The Germans prevents the personal meeting with the Americans.)
Through the CIC at Hallein, near Salzburg.
In 1948: through the German group of the Hungarian General Hodossy-Strobl. (Having learned my intention for a direct contact the Germans sent the most unfavorable information about us.)
Through the German contacting organ of the Hungarian Lt. Col (GS) Kollényi at Salzburg. (This authority is also crossing my intentions and is intriguing wherever possible.)
Through the attaché (military) of the US Consulate at Munich (Germany).

7
Recently both me and our members have been contacted by the US Intelligence organisation of Trieste (Italy).

I am in friendly terms with Mr Woods the Consul-General at Munich and with Mr. Koczak, US political adviser attached to the Mission at Bonn (Germany).

7. **Propaganda.** The connection with the broadcasting service of the Free Europe Inc. is mentioned above. Being the propaganda a first class Hungarian matter we conduct our activities in Hungary through our own organs.

I finish these "Information Notes" repeating my most sincere desire for the establishment of a personal contact, which I am convinced would serve the common fight against the Bolsheviks.


