1. Andras B. SZINAY, one of General ZAKO's men in the US, furnished the following information: *from ZAKO on alleged intelligence leaks*

"General ZAKO, leader of the CHV, directed me in his letter dated July 9th (received July 14th) to submit any information about the leaking out of a confidential Hungarian matter, handled by US Intelligence authorities in Austria.

"General ZAKO has obtained a copy of a recent resolution of the Committee of Incompatibility of the Hungarian National Council (339 E. 52nd Street, New York City). This resolution was drafted by three members of the five man committee, by Mr. Charles Peyer, Mr. Ferenc Nagy and Dr. Zoltan Pfeiffer, and was a result of a seven months hearing in a just Hungarian personal matter, the so-called 'Eckhardt case' related with our organization.

"Apart from many untrue assertions about the Comradeship of Hungarian Veterans, the resolution refers and gives publicity to a confidential memorandum which was prepared and handed over by General ZAKO on the request of the CIC Hallein (near Salzburg, Austria) in the fall of 1947, and dealt with the organization of the 'Kopjas' resistance movement in Hungary.

"General ZAKO has learned from the text that his memorandum was passed on (by CIC Salzburg which supposedly had gotten it from CIC Hallein) to the Hungarian subject Peter Zerkovicz, who made an illegal copy of that. The resolution mentions Zerkovicz by name.

"General ZAKO was also informed about this leaking out by another Hungarian too, named Szemes, who also read the memorandum in the past.

"The General was very surprised about the fact and felt that this information could probably not be indifferent to you and directed me to report that.


