1. WOHLTAT FURNISHED WRITTEN STATEMENT DATED 24 APRIL ANSWERING SEVEN QUESTIONS SUBMITTED BY C SUMMARY FOLLOWS:

A. MALAXA NEVER OFFICIALLY PARTICIPATED GERMAN-RUMANIAN NEGOTIATIONS BUT HELD FREQUENT PRIVATE TALKS WITH WOHLTAT, LAST TIME IN MARCH 39.

B. AT MALAXA'S REQUEST WOHLTAT HELPED HIM ESTABLISH CONTACTS WITH GERMAN INDUSTRIALISTS.

C. WOHLTAT NEVER HEARD MALAXA BEING INITIATOR BRITISH-RUMANIAN ECONOMIC NEGOTIATIONS IN 39. GERMAN SHARE IN RUMANIAN EXPORT TRADE 40-50 PERCENT AS COMPARED TO 10-15 PERCENT BRITISH SHARE.

D. MALAXA'S INFLUENCE BASED ON PERSONAL FRIENDSHIP WITH KING CAROL WHO GREATLY INTERESTED IN TRADING WITH GERMANY.

E. MALAXA WAS NEVER PRESSURED BY NSDAP CIRCLES WITH WHOM HE MAINTAINED NEITHER FRIENDLY NOR UNFRIENDLY RELATIONS.

F. WOHLTAT BELIEVES MALAXA FOLLOWED ROYAL LINE IN MAKING CONCESSIONS TO IRON GUARD.
