CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE EXCLUSIVE. Director Allen Dulles has warned the White House that the Russians will soon expell Ambassador Bohlen from Moscow. The tipoff Dulles says is the Soviet crackdown on the wife of an American diplomat Mrs. Carl Sommerlatte. The Russians are reported determined to force Bohlen out, because he is one of the very few American diplomats who speak Russian and guide the State Dept. on how to handle the Kremlin. Bohlen told Sen. Margaret Chase Smith about this spot when she visited Moscow. That explains why she reported she would not be surprised if the U.S. broke relations with Russia soon.

Marshall Tito of Yugoslavia has been invited by Eisenhower to visit Washington next spring. It's a reward for his finally settling Trieste.

Seoul. President Syngman Rhee has refused to sign a pledge not to use the Korean Army to attack North Korea. Twice we have asked Rhee to sign a pledge, twice he has refused.

The Pentagon. The Court of Military Appeals have reprimanded Adm. Theodore Raddick, President of a 12th Naval Dist. court martial. Adm. Raddick was charged with saying and I quote, "servicemen don't have any constitutional rights" unquote.
