1. We met with AEABYSS/1 at the home of his friend, [] on 6 January 1967. Subject had arrived from FJSTEAL on 16 December and returned to Identity/1. January. The debriefing of AEABYSS/1 is sent under separate attachment. AEABYSS/1 will return to Germany on or about 19 March, when the guarantee period for the plant his company has constructed will expire. There are no immediate plans for a new assignment for AEABYSS/1 in FJSTEAL.

2. The information reported by Subject again was routine in nature, with the exception, perhaps, of his observations of the Identity/2 plant. We had not given him any specific briefing prior to his last trip, nor did we brief him for his last tour in FJSTEAL, but Subject obviously is aware of our interests. This prompted him to pay more particular attention to the Identity/2 plant which he could see from his residence. If Headquarters feels that the information on this target, or on the major installation at which he has been engaged, can usefully be expanded by further debriefings, we can arrange for one or more lengthy sessions sometime after next March. In that case, we would appreciate a detailed brief to guide our interrogation.

3. Subject stated that his tour in FJSTEAL was highly successful from a professional stand point. He won the respect of the managers and directors of the plant he constructed, primarily for meeting his deadline, and for producing the planned quota for the installation. While he personally has reached the limits of endurance for tours in FJSTEAL, he knows that requests have been made for him by Identity/3 officials to assist in the running of a number of plants in FJSTEAL.

Whether his company will assign him to this task is in question, but Subject informed us that he would not agree to tours extending over six months.

4. Subject reported no unusual security problems. He said that he had been singled out and praised a number of times by PJSTRAL officials for not carrying a camera, and was cited as an example to other technicians who took photos freely. He also has made it a point to adhere strictly to the regulations concerning off limit areas, and has loudly prohibited his colleagues from violating them. He has remarked that a number of his colleagues have shown an unusual interest in plants and activities in such off limits areas; for example, within the large combine, and suspects them of working for some intelligence service.
