1. BND/FLEMING REQUESTS TRACES FOLLOWING PERSONS, WHO CLOSE ASSOCIATES OF UNGERMANN DURING IMMEDIATE POWTHAR ERA. PARTICULAR INTEREST IS ANY INFO WHICH THROWS ADDITIONAL LIGHT ON UNGERMANN:

A. MICHAEL A L S C H I B A Y A, DPOB 21 NOV 1908 IN KUTAIS GEORGIA. UNTIL 1945 SUBJ WAS MEMBER OF GEORGIAN NATIONAL COMMITTEE, IN BERLIN WHICH COOPERATED WITH THE REICHSMINISTERIUM OST, RSHA AND FOREIGN VOLUNTARY MILITARY UNITS. UNGERMANN WAS ACQUAINTED WITH SUBJECT DURING THIS PERIOD. AFTER 1945 SUBJ WORKED WITH PROF. VON M E N D E, WHO WAS LATER CHIEF OF THE BUREAU FOR STATELESS FOREIGNERS. SUBJ ALLEGEDLY CONNECTED WITH OSS FROM MAY TO AUTUMN 1945. THESE OSS TIES LED TO SWITZERLAND. VON MENDE, ALEXANDER T S O M A J A AND GIVI G A B L I A N I ALSO HAD TIES TO OSS. IN NOV 1945 SUBJ RESIDED IN MUNICH, MONTSALVAT STR. 7. SUBJ RECEIVED DOCUMENTATION FROM A U.S. CAPTAIN G A L L O W A Y, TRANSPORTATION OFFICER IN MUNICH AND

LT. GALBRAITH, INTERROGATION OFFICER, OBERURSEL. DURING 1945/46 UNGERMANN AND SUBJ WORKED TOGETHER IN SOME FORM OF TRANSPORTATION BUSINESS (WHETHER COVER OR REAL IS UNKNOWN). IN 1947 SUBJ BECAME ASSOCIATED WITH GEHLEN ORG. IN 1951 SUBJ APPLIED FOR IMMIGRATION TO THE US, BUT WAS REJECTED. FLEMING WOULD APPRECIATE FULL TRACES OF SUBJ, PARTICULARLY REASONS FOR HIS REJECTION FOR IMMIGRATION.

S. HANS NEINRICH HERWARTH VON BITTENFELD, DPOB 14 OCTOBER 1924 IN BERLIN. SUBJ AND UNGERMANN WORKED TOGETHER IN 1943 IN THE STAFF OF OXH IN CONNECTION WITH VOLUNTARY FOREIGN MILITARY UNITS. 1945/46 SUBJ WORKED FOR U.S. AGENCY AS ADVISOR ON SOVIET UNION. MAINTAINED CONTINUING CONTACT WITH UNGERMANN. SUBJ LATER BECAME FRG AMBASSADOR TO GREAT BRITAIN AND CHIEF OF FRG PRESIDENT'S OFFICER UNDER HENRICH LUEBKE. BND HAS NO DEROG INFO ON SUBJ AND CONSIDERS HIM TO BE HONORABLE ELDER STATESMAN, BUT ASKS, IF OUR FILE ON SUBJ REFERS IN ANY WAY TO UNGERMANN.

2. FLEING ALSO PREPARED REVIEW ABOVE DATA, IF VOLUMINOUS, WHEN HE COMES TO WASHINGTON, BUT WOULD APPRECIATE CABLE SUMMARY. NO MUNICH BASE TRACES.
