Subject: Voldemars MIDZINS

(Brief of Information)

On Sunday, 29 April 1962, Vitaliy L. GULAYEV, UN Secretariat, and a known KGB officer, was observed by the Bureau at 9:20 a.m. driving his car on the New England Thruway near Greenwich, Conn. He drove to Milford, Connecticut where he parked his car in back of the New Haven Railroad Station in a back alley. At 10:07 a.m. GULAYEV was seen meeting MIDZINS (subsequently identified) in front of the A&P market. They walked to a park bench and engaged in conversation and were seen exchanging papers. They spent an hour on the park bench and MIDZINS appeared to be writing. They then walked to the beach and Subject (GULAYEV) was seen to allow MIDZINS to walk in front of him while GULAYEV apparently checked behind him [for possible surveillance]. GULAYEV appeared to be frequently checking for possible surveillance. They spent 3/4 of an hour at the beach and then walked back to the bench and spent another 15 minutes there. They walked to River Street where they parted about 1:45 p.m. Subject then walked to his car in the alley and drove out of the area.

Bureau learned that Voldemars MIDZINS was born 30 June 1901 in Riga, Latvia. He entered the US from Germany on 6 April 1957. He is not an American citizen. He works for the Gypsun Co. in New Haven, Conn. His-wife-is Alma Zakis (MIDZINS.?) lives with Subject.
