Subject: YUGOSLAV CONSULATE GENERAL -
SAN FRANCISCO
INTERNAL SECURITY - YU

On August 28, 1954, a source of known reliability made available to our San Francisco office a "List" (Black Book) used by officials of the Yugoslav Consulate in connection with their official duties.

According to our source, this "List" is of recent origin, being dated March 3, 1954. In connection with the use of the "List," informant advised that whenever any person included in the "List" applies for any type of visa for the Federative People's Republic of Yugoslavia, the diplomatic and consular posts of the F.R.Y. must seek prior approval from the Federal Secretariat of Foreign Affairs or the Federal Secretariat of Internal Affairs, noting that said persons are on the "List."

The basis for this "List" and the source for the information contained therein were unknown to our informant.

There is attached a copy of this "List." This is for your information and is not intended for further dissemination.

In the event additional information in this matter is obtained you will be advised.
