

MAZARENKO, Nikolai Grigoryevich *MAZARENKO* 201-2162-8

Subj's former associates in Europe advised subj, spent 5 yrs in German-DF camps. Associates also state subj discharged from German Army for brutality to prisoners. Info regarding subj's employment by Soviet Police or NKVD apparently originated with one Mrs. Aleksandra PETRANKO, Freehold, NJ. (Employment allegedly in 1943 in Taganrog or Marzigel, Russia.) Subj not known to have had unusual amounts of money in Germany but believed to have been friendly with Sov MPs in Germany. Subj continues to reside at Kearsburg, NJ.

Mrs. Alexandra PETRANKO, Freehold, N. J., advised that she resided in same house as Subj in Taganrog, Russia for [redacted] 5 da in 1943. Subj was employed as police officer by German occupation forces and had held that position for about 1 yr. Subj wore Cossack uniform and undoubtedly was trusted by Germans and anti-Soviet groups. Subj left Taganrog during 2/43 to avoid Red Army, and to PETRANKO's knowledge, Subj was never active on behalf of Soviet Union. Subj resides now at Orangeburg, N. Y.
