OSTRICH passed through the lines on the night of 15 January. He crossed near Ettelbruck in Luxembourg, in territory controlled by 12 AG and the American Seventh Army. It is possible that we may hear from him through his father in Switzerland around 1 February

20 January - Saw Commandant Thomas and got his OK on the transfer to 18 Bd. Suchet of KAUTZ, wanted for interrogation in the BESEKOW case.

20 Jan - Saw Captain KLAIBER and read MOSER's report. From its content it would appear that the explosive dump found in his farm was placed there without the contents being known to him. MOSER was released on parole in view of the state of his health. Following this investigation MOSER's daughter was arrested, and found to be in possession of 375, 000 francs which she admitted belonged to OSTRICH. This money has been sequestered. This officer has asked Captain KLAIBER to have the daughter, if possible, released on parole, in view of our obligations to OSTRICH, and he has agreed.
