Source states that in the middle of August 1944, during the first part of his stay at BELFORT, the NAISSER group arrived. There was a Frenchman belonging to this group, named MARECHAL; subject is about 35 years old, 1m62 - 1m65 in height, thin, dark brown hair, little mustache, cross-eyed. Subject wore on his coat lapel the ribbon of the medal awarded to men who had fought in Russia. Although he belonged to NAISSER's group, subject did not live with source, but at the home of a Dr. SCHMIDT, Gerhard, vice-consul at the German Embassy, which at that time was also at BELFORT.

At first glance MARECHAL appeared slightly comic, one might even say crazy. On getting to know him better source found out he must have had an excellent education. Source talked to him several times.

Subject's father was with a French Embassy in Africa (?) but he apparently had no great feeling toward his family. According to what MARECHAL said, all the members of the family detest their father.

Subject must have been in Switzerland for some time; he speaks fair German and knows Switzerland well. He fought against Russia as a member of the L.V.F.. BESEKOW intended to send him to Switzerland as an agent for information since he apparently did not have the aptitude to perform sabotage. When source left BADENWEILER for the last time on October 10, subject was still there. He said once that in Switzerland he hoped to meet a friend who was very pro-German, a director of the British American Tobacco Co. He mentioned the name but source does not remember it.
