SUBJECT: Visit to Mme. DUPRE-MORAND, 7 rue de la Paix, Villefranche-sur-Saone.

*ced* Source reports the name on the door is "Mme. Leon DUPRE," but her husband is actually named "Lucien".

Source asked Mme. DUPRE for Mme. MORAND, and was told that she had gone to Paris at the end of the preceding week.

Source told Mme. DUPRE that he had come from Germany and brought her greetings from Pierre MORAND, who had given him her address. Mme. MORAND has had no news from her husband since he left Paris; she was arrested for ten days and everything was taken away from her. If source went back to Germany, he was to tell MORAND to transfer his property to his brother-in-law, DUPRE, a prisoner of war in Germany; in this way he could save his property.

She could not understand why Pierre had fled to Germany because he had done nothing wrong. Nevertheless she knew that his friend Charles GAUDIOT was seriously compromised.
