attached. It has just come to the writer's attention that Mr. Kolossvary-Kiss is included in Edition No. 5, April 1960, of the Visa Office Lockout Book. The firm GYL-Laber is not known to the Economic Section of this Consulate General, but according to Mr. Ney, it was established in November 1959. Mr. Ney said he wants to go to the U. S. to discuss with certain firms his recent discovery of a synthetic rosin.

A Form FS-247 in this office shows that Mr. Ney was found guilty of war crimes by a U. S. Military Court, case No. 5-100. During the interview with Mr. Ney, he did not volunteer this information when asked the question: "Have you ever been arrested, fined or imprisoned?" When the matter of the military trial was mentioned, he readily admitted he had been tried and convicted, and that he had served about three years of a life-imprisonment term for having been responsible for the killing of American pilots who had parachuted into the area under his command. His statements concerning the charges and the trial were substantially confirmed when we received the attached copy of the "Review of Record of Trial by Military Commission of Karoly Ney; U.S. vs Karoly Ney et al; Case No. 5-100" from the Office of the Judge Advocate, Headquarters, U. S. Army Europe. Mr. Ney stated he has no documents concerning his trial other than the enclosed copy of his release from prison (Entlassungszeugnis, April 2, 1948). The Judge Advocate's office informed us that the complete record of this trial had been retired to the U. S. and is available through the Office of the Judge Advocate General, Department of Army, Washington.

Since the complete record is unavailable here, the drafting officer is unable to make a recommendation on this case. The Department's advice is respectfully requested as to whether Mr. Ney is eligible to receive a visitor's visa.
